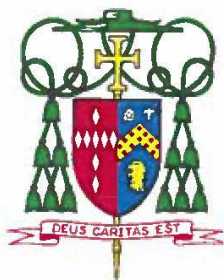

Over twenty-five years ago, the late African American Catholic historian and Benedictine monk, Fr. Cyprian Davis, published The History of Black Catholics in the United States. This work highlighted the fact that people of African ancestry have been an important part of the church in this country since before the beginning of our great nation.

Black Catholic Month has been reserved for November because a number of important dates to Catholics of African ancestry fall within this month.

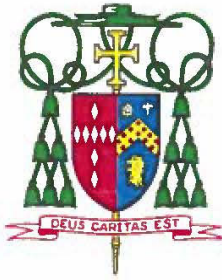
- November 1 – All Saints’ Day provides an opportunity to review the lives of the hundreds of saints of African ancestry in the first 300 years of the Church; Saints Perpetua and Felicity, Pope St. Victor I, and the martyrs of Alexandria are a few of the saints of African ancestry who embraced the Gospel message.
- November 3 – the Memorial of Saint Martin de Porres, the first and only saint of African Ancestry in this hemisphere.
- November 19 – the day in our Diocese this year when we will celebrate our annual African Heritage Celebration at 3:00 pm at Holy Name of Jesus Cathedral.

We continue to look to the saints, like Saint Peter Claver and Saint Pope John Paul II, who said in his 1987 visit to the United States that the Church’s evangelization and ministry to the African American Catholic community is “a sign of the unity and universality of the Church and of her mission.”

Please join me in celebrating this catholicity of the Church, Her truly universal character embracing many peoples, each with many gifts. May Our Lord Jesus Christ bless you and protect you, and may Mary, the Mother of God, watch over you and guide you always.

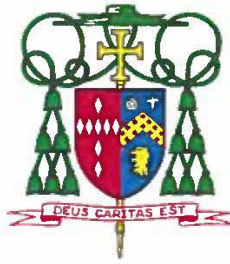

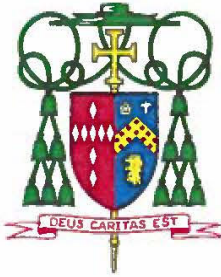

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,


